Bids must be submitted electronically, with all necessary documents in a clear, legible, Portable Document Format (PDF) attachment, to: cdcr-obs-non-it-goods-bids@cdcr.ca.gov, no later than the time and date specified in the RFQ Notice to Prospective Bidders.

Any bid received in any other manner will **NOT** be considered. Bid submission time will be recorded using the electronic time stamp associated with receipt of the email submission. CDCR will provide an automated email response confirming receipt of each submission received showing the date and time the submission was received. If a confirmation receipt is not received, please contact cdcr-obs-non-it-goods-bids@cdcr.ca.gov to confirm your bid was received. Confirmation receipt is not a representation by CDCR that the submitted bid is responsive and complete.

Any electronic bid received after the Submission of Bid date and time specified in the RFQ 4007 will **NOT** be considered. Bidders are ultimately responsible for ensuring timely receipt of their bid. ***It is recommended that Bidders submit bids at least one (1) hour in advance of the bid submission deadline to allow for confirmation of bid submission.*** Bid submissions with attached PDF documents more than forty (40) Megabytes in size risk being undeliverable. The State's mail server may automatically reject excessively large emails. Bidder may submit multiple emails if file size exceeds forty (40) Megabytes. Multiple emails should be identified as follows: 1 of 3, 2 of 3, 3 of 3, etc. Links to files stored on the internet (e.g., Google Drive, Dropbox) in lieu of attachments are not acceptable, and any documents stored at such links will not be reviewed.

***PAYMENT DISCOUNT OFFERS**

Discounts will not be considered when evaluating bid responses for award purposes. However, discounts may be offered and taken by the State when processing invoices within the timeframe specified. Whenever possible, the CDCR will accept the offer of cash discounts for payment terms other than those specified in the General Provisions section 10.2 (i.e., Net 45). Please do not reference or include payment terms that conflict with the provisions of the California Prompt Payment Act, Government Code Section 927 et. seq. The Act requires state agencies to pay properly submitted, undisputed invoices not more than 45 days after (i) the date of acceptance of goods or performance of services; or (ii) receipt of an undisputed invoice, whichever is later.

DELIVERY

Final delivery, inspection, and acceptance shall be at the shipping address location(s) described herein.

PRICES

Prices shall be all inclusive. Only the prices submitted in the bid response shall be accepted and included in the awarded purchase order.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Substitutions for like items may be accepted at the State's discretion if the requested item is not available and the substitute item is equivalent to, or exceeds the standards, of the original request. The State reserves the right to determine whether a substitute offer is equivalent to and meets the standards of quality required.

CDCR SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

If delivering to a CDCR institution, special terms and conditions apply. Suppliers must observe all institution security rules and regulations. Delivery drivers may be required to obtain gate clearance prior to delivery. Suppliers shall contact the institution regarding specific requirements prior to attempting delivery. All persons entering institution grounds must have a valid state driver's license or photo identification card on their person. Clothing restrictions apply. See CDCR Special Terms and Conditions attachment for more details.

TOBACCO-FREE ENVIRONMENT

Pursuant to Penal Code § 5030.1, the possession or use of tobacco products by any person on the grounds of any institution or facility under the jurisdiction of CDCR is prohibited.

FACSIMILE (FAX) BID SUBMITTALS

Faxed bid submittals will be considered only if they are sent to _____. Bids sent to any other fax number will not be considered. To be considered, all pages of a faxed bid must be completely received prior to the due date and time specified in this solicitation. The State assumes no responsibility if a supplier cannot transmit their bid via fax, or if the entire bid is not received prior to the due date and time.

BIDDER DECLARATION (GSPD-05-105)

All suppliers must complete the Bidder Declaration GSPD-05-105 and submit it with the bid response. When completing the declaration, suppliers must identify all subcontractors proposed for participation in the contract; this includes equipment manufacturers, equipment distributors and resellers. A subcontractor is any person, firm, corporation, or organization contracting to perform any part of the prime's contract. Suppliers awarded a contract are contractually obligated to use the subcontractors for

the corresponding work identified unless the State agrees to a substitution, and it is incorporated by amendment to the contract. All certified small businesses (SBs) and/or Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs) must perform a “commercially useful function” in the performance of the contract as defined in Government Code Section 14837 (d)(4).

SB / DVBE CERTIFICATION

Suppliers must be certified by California as a small business/DVBE to participate in this solicitation. The DGS Procurement Division, Office of Small Business and DVBE Services (OSDS) is the state’s certifying agency. Suppliers claiming preferences/incentives must provide their California SB/MB/DVBE certification number on page 1 of this RFQ. Completed certification applications and required support documents must be submitted to the OSDS no later than 5:00 p.m. on the bid due date and the OSDS must be able to approve the application as submitted. SB/Nonprofit Veteran Service Agencies (NVSA’s) must possess certification by California prior to the day and time bids are due. Online applications are located on the [Cal eProcure](#) website. DVBE DECLARATIONS (DGS PD 843)

Per the Military and Veterans Code Section 999.2, the DVBE Declarations (DGS PD 843) must be completed and signed by all disabled veteran business owner(s) and disabled veteran business manager(s) when a DVBE contractor or subcontractor will provide materials, supplies, services or equipment. When applicable, the completed form must be included with the bid response.

DVBE SUBCONTRACTING – REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Contractor understands and agrees to comply with the requirements set forth in Military and Veterans Code Section 999 et seq. Should award of this contract be based in part on their commitment to use the Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) subcontractor(s) identified in their bid or offer, per Military and Veterans Code section 999.5 (g), a DVBE subcontractor may only be replaced by another DVBE subcontractor and must be approved by both the awarding department and the Department of General Services (DGS) prior to the commencement of any work by the proposed subcontractor. Changes to the scope of work that impact the DVBE subcontractor(s) identified in the bid or offer and approved DVBE substitutions will be documented by contract amendment. Failure of Contractor to seek substitution and adhere to the DVBE participation level identified in the bid or offer may be cause for contract termination, recovery of damages under rights and remedies due to the State, and penalties as outlined in MVC Section 999.9; Public Contract Code (PCC) Section 10115.10 Upon completion of this Contract, the department requires the prime contractor to certify information using the [Prime Contractor’s Certification – DVBE Subcontracting Report \(STD 817\)](#). If for this Contract, the Contractor made a commitment to achieve the DVBE participation goal by subcontracting to a DVBE, the Department will withhold \$10,000 from the final payment, or the full final payment if less than \$10,000, until the Contractor complies with the certification requirements above. A Contractor that fails to comply with the certification requirement shall, after written notice, be allowed to cure the defect. Notwithstanding any other law, if, after 30 calendar days from the date of written cure notice, the prime contractor refuses to comply with the certification requirements, the department shall permanently deduct \$10,000 from the final payment, or the full payment if less than \$10,000. (MVC § 999.7)

A person or entity that knowingly provides false information shall be subject to a civil penalty for each violation. (MVC § 999.5(d); Govt. Code § 14841)

Contractor agrees to comply with the rules, regulations, ordinances, and statutes that apply to the DVBE program as defined in Section 999 of the MVC, including, but not limited to, the requirements of Section 999.5(d). (PCC Code § 10230)

DVBE subcontractors will be notified at the time of award that their firm has been listed for participation in an agreement. Upon request, the prime contractor shall also provide proof of payment to the DVBE for subcontractor work.

TIRE-DERIVED PRODUCTS PREFERENCE

Per Public Resources Code (PRC) section 42890 et seq., a 5 percent (5%) recycle preference is available for recycled tire products (also known as tire-derived products). When evaluating bids, application of the tire recycle preference is only applicable if both virgin products and recycled content products (RCP) are acceptable for a line item. Should only recycled content products be bid, then the preference is not calculated. Should a solicitation include a mix of line items containing both qualified and non-qualified tire-derived RCPs, the preference shall only apply to qualified line items. If line-item awards are made, the preference shall be applied, to the extent possible, so as to maximize award to bidders proposing recycled tire products (PRC section 42892).

Target Area Contract Preference Act (TACPA) Preference (STD. 830)

This solicitation provides for the optional TACPA preference. Bidders are not required to apply for this preference. Denial of the TACPA preference request is not a basis for rejection of the bid/offer.

The TACPA workplace and workforce preferences will be evaluated for this solicitation. California-based companies seeking TACPA preferences will need to complete and submit preference request forms with the bid/offer. By submitting TACPA forms, a bidder given a TACPA preference agrees to the TACPA contract provisions required by Government Code section 4535 and provided in section 1896.40 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR) in addition to requirements specified on the TACPA form [STD 830](#).

CALIFORNIA CIVIL RIGHTS LAWS CERTIFICATION

Pursuant to Public Contract Code 2010, a person that submits a bid to, or otherwise proposes to enter into or renew a contract with, a state agency with respect to any contract in the amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) or more shall certify, under penalty of perjury, at the time the bid is submitted, or the contract is renewed, compliance with the Unruh Civil Rights Act. (Section 51 of the Civil Code) and the Fair Employment and Housing Act (Section 12960 of the Government Code).

RECYCLED CONTENT PRODUCTS

State agencies are required to report purchases in many product categories. In order to comply with those requirements, suppliers are required to complete and return the attached Postconsumer Recycled-Content Certification form (CalRecycle 74) with their bid response. PAYEE DATA RECORD (STD. 204) AND CDCR SUPPLEMENT

The successful bidder **may** be required to submit a Payee Data Record, STD. 204, and/or a CDCR Supplement Vendor Payee Data form listing payee information and their Taxpayer Identification Number (upon request prior to award if currently not on file with CDCR or if there are business information updates needed).

PROHIBITION ON TAX DELINQUENTS

Persons or companies identified as the largest tax delinquents by the Franchise Tax Board (FTB) or the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) under authority of Sections 7063 or 19195 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, shall be disqualified from the bidding process. PCC §10295.4. Contractors included on tax delinquency lists; contracts void and unenforceable; (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a state agency shall not enter into any contract for the acquisition of goods or services with a contractor whose name appears on either list of the 500 largest tax delinquencies pursuant to Section 7063 or 19195 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. Any contract entered into in violation of this subdivision is void and unenforceable. (b) This section shall apply to any contract executed on or after July 1, 2012.

DARFUR CONTRACTING ACT

All bidders will be required to submit a completed DARFUR Contracting Act Certification Form. Effective January 1, 2009, CDCR generally cannot contract with “scrutinized” companies that do business in the African nation of Sudan, as described in PCC §§ 10475 -10478. A company that currently has (or within the previous three years has had) business activities or other operations outside of the United States must certify that it is not a “scrutinized” company when it submits a bid or proposal to CDCR. A scrutinized company may still submit a bid or proposal for a contract with CDCR if the company first obtains permission from the DGS.

CALIFORNIA SELLER’S PERMIT

If applicable, award will be contingent upon providing your company’s California retailer’s seller’s permit number or certification of registration and, if applicable, the permit or certification of all participating affiliates, issued by the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA), pursuant to all requirements as set forth in §§ 6487, 7101 and sections 6452.1, 6487.3, 18510 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, and Section 10295.1 of the Public Contract Code. In order to expedite the process of verifying the validity of the permit, provide the CDTFA issued seller’s permit number on page 1 of this RFQ or attach a copy of the permit with your bid response.

RESPONSIVE BID

A bid that clearly substantiates compliance, without material deviation, with all specifications, requirements, and the terms and conditions of the solicitation. If a bidder has been determined to be non-responsive, the bid shall be rejected.

RESPONSIBLE BIDDER

Bidders may be required to submit further evidence of their qualifications at such times and under conditions, as it may deem necessary. If a bidder has been determined to be non-responsible, the bid shall be rejected.

BID EVALUATION – TIE BETWEEN BIDDERS

In the event of a precise tie between bidders, the CDCR procurement official will conduct a coin toss. At least one witness must observe and document the coin toss. Affected bidders will be given the opportunity to attend the tie breaker coin toss. An email notification will be sent to the affected bidders at least 24 hours before the coin toss is conducted.

Note: In the event of a precise tie between the bid of an SB/MB and the bid of a DVBE that is also a SB/MB, the award shall go to the DVBE that is also an SB/MB. (Reference GC section 14838 (f) and 2 CCR section 1896.8(f)).

Note: Recycled tire product contracts will be awarded to the bidder whose product has the greatest percentage of recycled tire content if the fitness, quality, and price are equal. (PRC section 42894) “Recycled tire product” means a product with not less than 50 percent of its total content derived from recycled used tires. (PRC section 42890).

SUPPLIER TERMS AND CONDITIONS / QUOTATION ATTACHMENTS

Quote responses that reference a supplier’s own terms and conditions, legal terms, or provisions that conflict with the State’s General Provisions shall be considered non-responsive and will be rejected. The state objects to and will not evaluate or consider any additional terms or conditions submitted by a bidder.

CONFIDENTIALITY

During the evaluation of bids received in response to a competitive solicitation and prior to contract award information relating to bid evaluation is confidential. Any disclosure of confidential information by the bidder during the procurement process is a basis for rejecting the bidder’s proposal and finding the bidder ineligible. Total confidentiality during the procurement process is vital to preserve the integrity of the process.

LOSS LEADER

It is unlawful for any person engaged in business within this state to sell or use any article or product as a “loss leader” as defined in § 17030 of the Business and Professions Code. A “loss leader” is any article or product sold at less than cost: (a) where the purpose is to induce, promote, or encourage the purchase of other merchandise; or (b) where the effect is a tendency or capacity to mislead or deceive purchasers or prospective purchasers; or (c) where the effect is to divert trade from or otherwise injure competitors.

CHANGE ORDERS/AMENDMENTS

Any purchase order resulting from this quote may be amended, modified (within the scope of the original agreement), or terminated at any time by mutual agreement of the parties in writing. Change orders amending, modifying, or terminating the purchase order, including modifications of compensation payable, may only be issued by an authorized State Procurement Official. All such change orders shall be in writing and issued only upon written concurrence of the supplier.

EXECUTIVE ORDER N-6-22 – RUSSIA SANCTIONS

On March 4, 2022, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order [N-6-22](#) (the EO) regarding Economic Sanctions against Russia and Russian entities and individuals. “Economic Sanctions” refers to sanctions imposed by the U.S. government in response to Russia’s actions in Ukraine, as well as

any sanctions imposed under state law. By submitting a bid or proposal, Contractor represents that it is not a target of Economic Sanctions. Should the State determine Contractor is a target of Economic Sanctions or is conducting prohibited transactions with sanctioned individuals or entities, that shall be grounds for rejection of the Contractor's bid/proposal any time prior to contract execution, or, if determined after contract execution, shall be grounds for termination by the State.

Assembly Bill 418: The California Food Safety Act

The California Food Safety Act, chapter 17 (commencing with Section 109025) is added to Part 3 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code [Bill Text - AB-418 The California Food Safety Act.](#)

Commencing January 1, 2027, a person or entity shall not manufacture, sell, deliver, distribute, hold, or offer for sale, in commerce a food product for human consumption that contains any of the following substances:

- (1) Brominated vegetable oil (CAS no. 8016-94-2)
- (2) Potassium bromate (CAS no. 7758-01-2)
- (3) Propylparaben (CAS no. 94-13-3)
- (4) Red dye 3 (CAS no. 16423-68-0)

Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI)

The State of California seeks to realize the potential benefits of GenAI, through the development and deployment of GenAI tools, while balancing the risks of these new technologies.

Bidder/Offeror/Contractor shall immediately notify the State in writing if it: (1) intends to provide GenAI as a Deliverable to the State; or (2) intends to utilize GenAI, including GenAI from third parties, to complete all or a portion of any Deliverable that materially impacts: (i) functionality of the System, (ii) risk to the State, or (iii) Contract performance. For avoidance of doubt, the term "materially impacts" as used in this section shall have the same meaning set forth in State Administrative Manual (SAM) 4986.2 Definitions for GenAI

The GenAI Reporting and Factsheet (OBS 1000) must be completed by the Bidder/Offeror/Contractor.

Failure to submit the GenAI Reporting and Factsheet (OBS 1000) will result in disqualification of the Bidder/Offeror/Contractor. Failure to report GenAI to the State may void any resulting contract. The State reserves its right to seek any and all relief to which it may be entitled to as a result of such non-disclosure. Upon receipt of a Bidder/Offeror/Contractor GenAI Reporting and Factsheet (OBS 1000), the state reserves the right to incorporate GenAI Special Provisions into the final contract or reject bids/offers that present an unacceptable level of risk to the State.

Assembly Bill 778 – Purchase of California-Grown Agricultural Food Products

Assembly Bill 778, Institutional Purchasers: Purchase of California-Grown Agricultural Food Products (2021-2022) amended Section 58595 of the Food and Agricultural Code, requiring a California state-owned or state-run institution that purchases agricultural food products to ensure at least 60% of the agricultural food products that it purchases in a calendar year are grown or produced in the state by December 31, 2025. If a bidder is offering agricultural food products, the OBS 1600 form is required for the state's data collection and reporting towards the 60% goal. Bidder

must identify if the agricultural food product is grown or produced in California or not.

1. SCOPE

- 1.1 These bid specifications and administrative requirements establish the requirements for paper towels and toilet paper to be used by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) at statewide institutions.
- 1.2 This purchase will be utilizing the department's consolidated purchasing capacity to leverage lowest price based on large quantity discounts.

2. SPECIFICATIONS AND STANDARDS

- 2.1 Specifications, standards, and administrative requirements referenced in this document shall be in effect on the date and at the time of quote submittal and are a part of the solicitation. The minimum requirements for this request for quotation are detailed in the Quote Worksheet showing size, quantities, and unit of measure. **CDCR is allowing for a .05" (+or-) dimensional tolerance.**

3. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- 3.1 Standard Items;
Product shall be a typical and continuing item(s) in the manufacturing line and shall be identified by general style, type and size in the manufacturer's catalog.
- 3.2 Size;
Various sizes and colors as specified on the Quote Worksheet.
- 3.3 Materials and Construction;
Product shall be new and/or recycled content, first quality, no irregulars or seconds and suitable for the intended use.

4. ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- 4.1 All deliveries shall be F.O.B. Destination, Freight Pre-Paid.
- 4.2 Deliveries will be made to various locations throughout the State of California (see attached Delivery Schedule)
- 4.3 Prior delivery arrangements shall be made for all deliveries whether for complete or partial orders, no exceptions. Shipments of incorrect items shall be returned to the supplier at no cost to the State.

5. SUPPLIER RESPONSIBILITIES

- 5.1 Clothing -See attached Special Terms and Conditions.
- 5.2 Reporting -See attached Special Terms and Conditions
- 5.3 License to do business - Suppliers must be licensed to do business with the State of California and shall possess and maintain throughout the term of this agreement all necessary licenses, permits, and/or certifications required by law, commercial general, automobile liability and worker's compensation insurance and must be presented, upon demand by CDCR staff.
- 5.4 Compliance - Supplier is responsible for compliance with all applicable laws, codes, rules and regulations. Supplier shall ensure that all employees have been informed of all rules and regulations.

6. PACKAGING REQUIREMENTS

- 6.1 The paper towels and toilet paper will be delivered in the unit of measure of CASES, not by EACH
- 6.2 Cases shall contain only 1 size of paper towels and one size for toilet paper
- 6.3 Cases are to be secured to the pallet with shrink wrap.
- 6.4 Toilet Paper pallets are not to be stacked more than 5 cases high, 25 cases to a pallet (unless otherwise specified by the individual institution).
- 6.5 Paper Towel pallets (singlefold & multifold) are not to be stacked more than 9 cases high, 72 cases to a pallet.(unless otherwise specified by the individual institution).
- 6.6 Paper Towel pallets (rolls/hardwound) are not to be stacked more than 8 cases high, 64 cases to a pallet.(unless otherwise specified by the individual institution).
- 6.7 All shipping Cases/Pallets shall be marked on the outside in large black letters with the following information:
 - Quantity
 - Size(s)
 - Purchase Order (PO) number
- 6.8 Open or damaged cases shall not be accepted and will be returned to the supplier at no cost to the State.

CDCR Special Terms and Conditions

1. Clothing Restrictions: For security reasons, while on institution grounds, suppliers and all its agents and/or representatives must not wear clothing that in any way resembles state issued inmate or ward clothing. Specifically, blue denim pants and blue chambray shirts, orange/yellow/white/chartreuse jumpsuits and/or yellow rainwear. Suppliers should contact the institution regarding clothing restrictions prior to requiring access to the institution to assure the supplier and their employees are in compliance.
2. Prison Rape Elimination Policy: CDCR maintains a zero tolerance for sexual misconduct in its institutions, community correctional facilities, camps, and for all offenders under its jurisdiction. All sexual misconduct is strictly prohibited. CDCR is committed to providing a safe, humane, secure environment, free from sexual misconduct. This will be accomplished by maintaining a program to ensure education/prevention, detection, response, investigation, and tracking of sexual misconduct. All suppliers are expected to ensure compliance with this policy as described in Department Operations Manual, Chapter 5, Article 44 which can be located at: www.cdcr.ca.gov/regulations/cdcr-regulations/dom-toc/. As a supplier, you and your staff are required to adopt and comply with the PREA standards, 28 Code of Federal Regulations Part 115. As a supplier for CDCR, you shall not assign an employee to a CDCR facility or assign an employee to duties if that employee will have contact with CDCR inmates, if that employee has 1) engaged in sexual abuse in a prison, jail, lockup, community confinement facility, juvenile facility, or other institution (as defined in 42 U.S.C. 1997); 2) been convicted of engaging or attempting to engage in sexual activity in the community facilitated by force, overt or implied threats of force, or coercion, or if the victim did not consent or was unable to consent or refuse; or 3) has been civilly or administratively adjudicated to have engaged in the activity described herein. By signing below the supplier agrees to ensure that all of the mandates referenced herein are complied with.
3. Security Regulations: Suppliers shall observe all security rules and regulations and comply with all instructions given by institutional authorities while on institution grounds.
 - a. Due to security procedures, suppliers may be delayed at vehicle/pedestrian gates and sally ports. Any loss of time checking in and out of the institution grounds shall be borne by the supplier.
 - b. Delivery drivers may be required to obtain gate clearance prior to entry. Suppliers shall contact the institution regarding specific gate clearance regulations prior to attempting deliveries. If gate clearance is required, the supplier will be required to complete a Request for Gate Clearance for all persons entering the facility a minimum of ten (10) working days prior to commencement of delivery and/or service. The gate clearance check will include Department of Motor Vehicles check, Wants and Warrants check, and Criminal History Check. All persons entering the facilities must have a valid state driver's license or photo identification card on their person.
 - c. Per PC Sections 5054 and 5058; CCR, Title 15, Section 3304 and 4603; and WIC Section 1712, CDCR does not recognize hostages for bargaining purposes. CDCR has a "NO HOSTAGE" policy.
 - d. All persons entering onto institution/facility/camp grounds consent to search of their person, property, or vehicle at any time. Refusal by individuals to submit to a search may be cause for denial of access to the premises.
 - e. It is illegal for an individual who has been previously convicted of a felony offense and confined in any State prison in this state to enter into CDCR adult institutions/facilities or camps, or youth institutions/facilities or camps, without the prior approval of the Warden or officer in charge. - Single Member Limited Liability Companies (LLCs) that is disregarded as an entity separate from its owner for federal tax purposes - enter the name of the individual or business entity that is tax liable for the business in section 1. Enter the DBA, LLC name, trade, or fictitious name under Business Name.
- Note: for the State of California tax purposes, a Single Member LLC is not disregarded from its owner, even if they may be disregarded at the Federal level.

Section 3 – Tax Identification Number

The TIN is required by R&TC sections 18646 and 18661 to facilitate tax compliance enforcement activities and preparation of Form 1099 and other information returns as required by the IRC section 6109(a) and R&TC section 18662 and its regulations.

Section 4 – Payee Residency Status**Are you a California resident or nonresident?**

- A corporation will be defined as a "resident" if it has a permanent place of business in California or is qualified through the Secretary of State to do business in California.
- A partnership is considered a resident partnership if it has a permanent place of business in California.
- An estate is a resident if the decedent was a California resident at time of death.
- A trust is a resident if at least one trustee is a California resident.
 - For individuals and sole proprietors, the term "resident" includes every individual who is in California for other than a temporary or transitory purpose and any individual domiciled in California who is absent for a temporary or transitory purpose. Generally, an individual who comes to California for a purpose that will extend over a long or indefinite period will be considered a resident. However, an individual who comes to perform a particular contract of short duration will be considered a nonresident.
