Performance and/or Design Requirements (e.g. intended use, function or application, compatibility, requirements; reference to policy, rule, statute or other act of the Legislature, etc., as appropriate):

Securitas Technology Corporation (Securitas) has installed proprietary security systems at the following locations: the Florida State Fire College campus in Ocala; three DCI Bureau of Insurance Fraud offices in Lake Wales, Fort Myers, and Tampa; and the SFM office in Tampa.

The Department also requires security monitoring services at all locations except the Florida State Fire College, which uses the proprietary systems in conjunction with other monitoring services. The security systems provide camera surveillance, card readers, and a detailed log of all persons who enter the premises for all locations. In addition to these system features, Securitas

will provide visual recordings of all vehicle tag numbers that enter the Florida State Fire College. Card readers also deny or allow access to any area of the campus or field office. Periodic maintenance and software updates are needed for the installed systems at all listed locations, which only Securitas is authorized to provide.

Estimated Dollar Amount: \$56,292.00

Justification for single source acquisition (what is necessary and unique about the product, service or source; steps taken to confirm unavailability of competition, as appropriate):

No other organizations or technicians are authorized or capable of performing software programming, updates, maintenance, or other modifications to Securitas' proprietary equipment. The Department, therefore, intends to proceed with a single source purchase to continue these services. This includes monitoring at all designated locations, excluding the Florida State Fire College—and periodic maintenance and software updates for the installed security systems. This is needed to ensure the safety of students at the Florida State Fire College, as well as the safety and security of staff, guests, and other assets at the other specified locations. The Department currently receives these services from Securitas, which is the sole provider capable of meeting these requirements.
